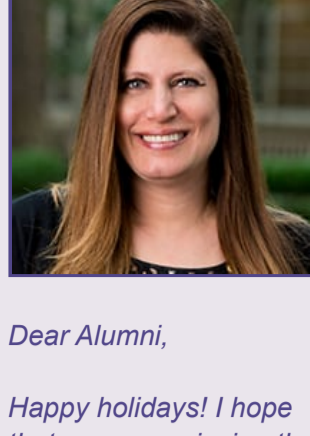

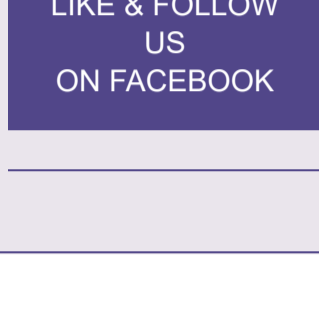

We wish you much happiness and joy this holiday season. Please reach out with any questions.

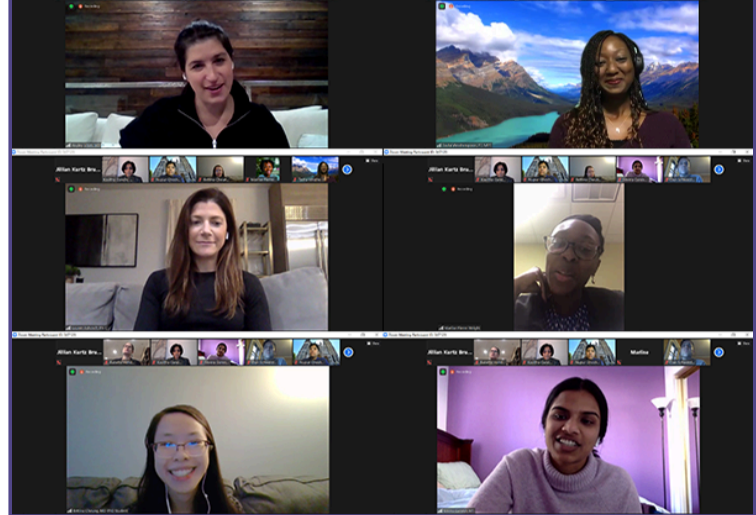

Women in STEM: The Next Generation

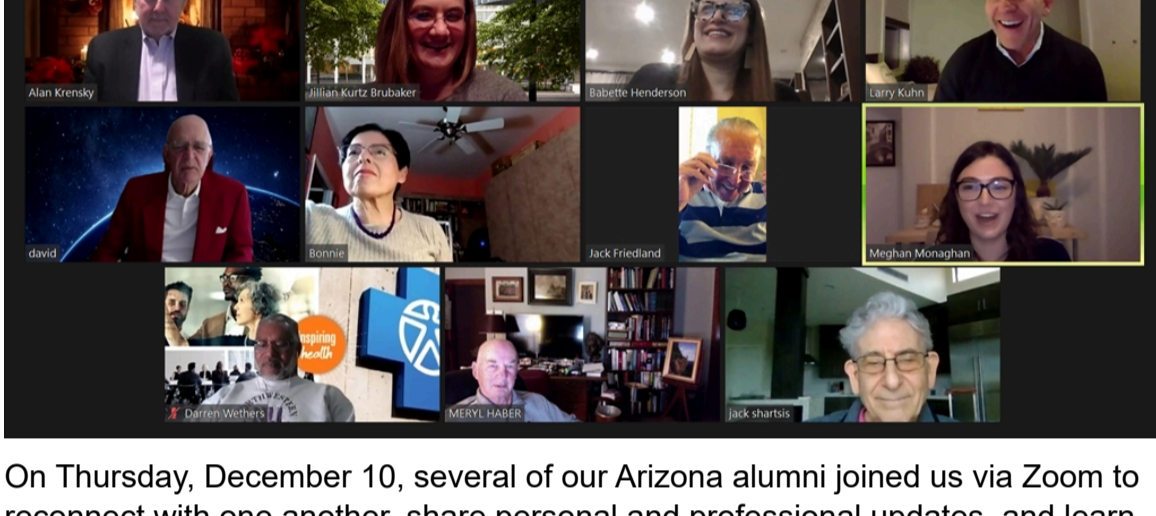

"The Holiday Season at Marshall Field's"

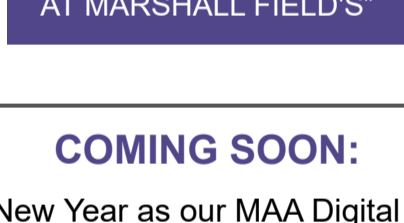


We're thrilled to share with you the newest installment of the MAA digital series from our favorite historian, alumnus **Joseph Gugenheim, '72 MD!**

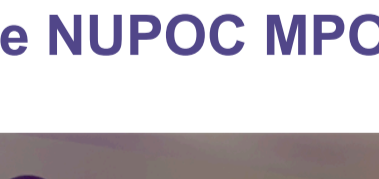
"That Was Then, This Is Now: The Names Behind the Buildings" with Joseph Gugenheim, '72 MD

Coming in March, we'll be hosting an exciting Zoom event, featuring the second installment in our "That Was Then, This is Now" series.

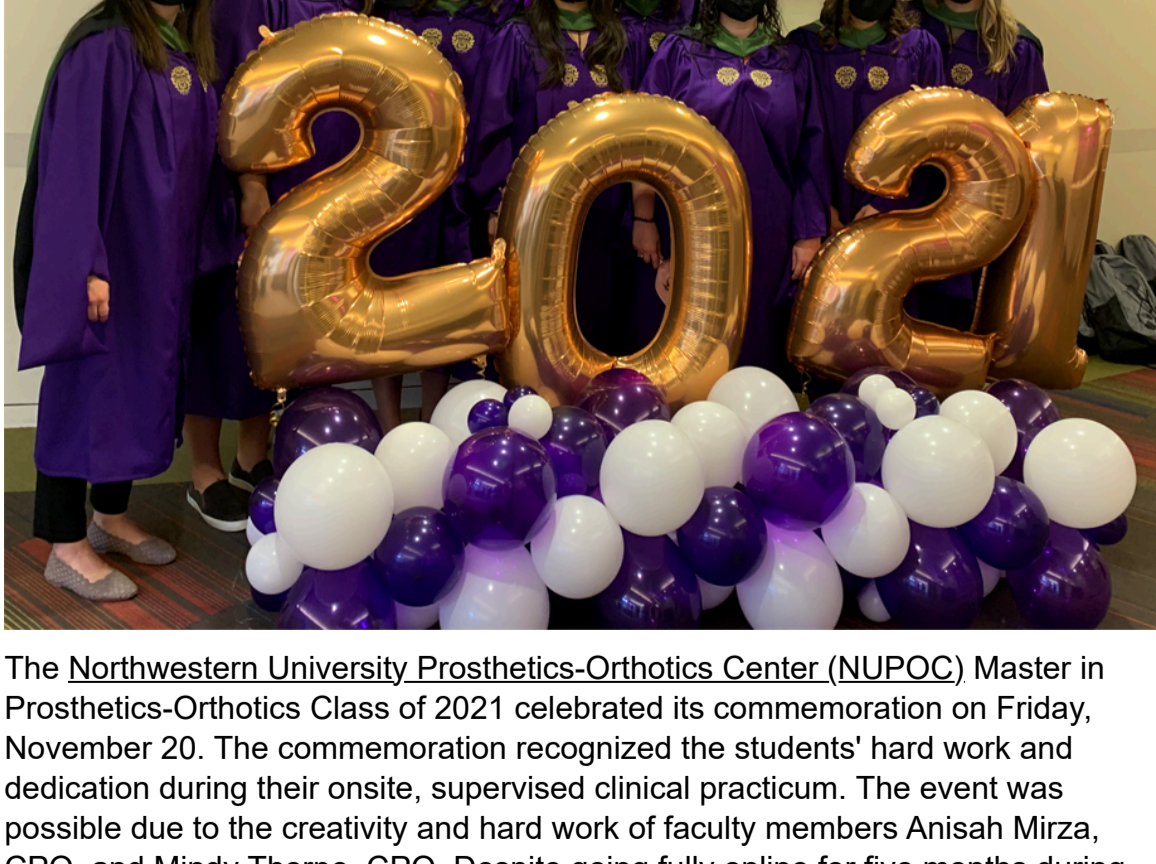
