"Water and Chicago: Blessing or Curse? Part One"





She was honored at the LLS Research Awards & Networking Event on Sunday, December 8, in San Diego, where she joined 30,000 others at the American Society of Hematology Annual Meeting and Exposition. Dr. Melo-Cardenas, assistant professor of Pathology at Feinberg, is researching the factors that cause inflammation in blood cells, a key driver of cancer development. The LLS recognizes researchers whose innovative work has the potential to improve outcomes for patients with blood cancer through the Career Development Achievement Award.
