

Northwestern University Advises Alumni to Prepare for Google Account Changes



Feinberg alumni with University Google accounts are being advised to back up or transfer their Google Drive and Google Photos data by March 13, 2025. As Google is ending its free unlimited storage program for qualifying educational institutions, Northwestern has decided to remove Google Drive and Google Photos services from alumni accounts. Account holders will retain access to their files in Google Drive and Google Photos until 11:59 p.m. CDT on March 13, 2025, after which those files will be deleted and alumni accounts will include access only to Gmail, Google Calendar, and select services not tied to Google Drive. Northwestern will also be closing the Google accounts of anyone who has not logged into their account within the past two years. <u>Get more information</u>.


