This Time Last Year: A Tale of Two Gordons

The nametags at Alumni Weekend 2023 had us seeing double! The weekend offered an opportunity for a long-awaited meeting between two distinguished Dr. Gordons from Northwestern University. Leo I. Gordon, MD, the Abby and John Friend Professor of Oncology Research and professor of Medicine in the Divisions of Hematology and Oncology is a pioneer in lymphoma research at Feinberg. Our alum, **Leo A. Gordon, '73 MD**, is professor of Surgery at Cedars-Sinai in Los Angeles, California, and senior consultant in Clinical Surgery at the Surgery Group of Los Angeles. Despite never having met, the two have experienced several humorous miscommunications and been confused for one another over the years. Dr. Leo A. Gordon has fielded everything from Northwestern committee meeting invitations to phone calls meant for Dr. Leo I. Gordon.

Our alum, Dr. Leo A. Gordon, shared one particularly memorable incident when he received a call inviting him to deliver a keynote address at a lymphoma conference. As he playfully negotiated firstclass tickets, a private driver, and a luxurious hotel suite, the caller paused, asking if he was indeed the Dr. Leo Gordon from Northwestern. With a chuckle, he affirmed, only to be met with confusion when she realized his requirements might be a bit excessive. He then clarified the mix-up, leading to a good laugh and the caller's relief as she connected with the correct Dr. Gordon.

Alumni Weekend provided a perfect opportunity for both doctors to finally meet in person and share a laugh over the humor of their mistaken identities. Thank you to alum Dr. Leo A. Gordon for sharing this story with us!

Congrats Are in Order!

Mark Nolan Hill, '77 MD, FACS (*pictured in uniform and top left in red shirt*), a Navy veteran (Ensign) and surgeon, was selected as the Medical Guardian for the 117th Veterans Honor Flight from Chicago to Washington, D.C. This flight, the largest so far, included 116 WWII, Korean War, and Vietnam War veterans. Dr. Hill was thrilled to discover that his favorite surgical professor from Northwestern, Stuart Poticha, MD (*pictured top left with Dr. Hill and top right*), a Vietnam Army captain and MASH chief of surgery, was also on the flight. It was their first meeting since the 1970s. Initially expecting a polished

tour of military memorials, Dr. Hill shared that the public's overwhelming gratitude moved him. The journey included visits to military memorials, a police escort, and a special Mail Call with personalized letters for each veteran. Dr. Hill, who led a medical team of 13 nurses, later presented the experience to the Highland Park mayor and City Council. Congratulations, Dr. Hill!

This award recognizes physical therapists' exceptional leadership potential and early career contributions to acute care.
